Happy April everyone! As we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ this month, remembering how death has been defeated, and how you and I can have new life in Christ. I feel it is analogous to the situation we find ourselves in. We held a church conference on March 18 and voted with 72% majority to become part of a new church in four locations, Mitchell, Morrill, Henry, and Scottsbluff. Just as the Lord led us to this decision, I believe the Lord has a plan for our future. One that will be meant for good and not for disaster, to give us a future and a hope.

Our former church was wonderful, and I know you have all loved your church, loved each other, loved our worship, and you loved the impact we made in our community. But like people, all churches have a life span. They are born, they grow, they plateau, and then they decline, and eventually die. I believe the closing of the First Christian Church in Scottsbluff is an eye opener to us. This once active, vibrant and fruitful church closed its doors for good just a few weeks ago, offering evidence that churches have life spans; that we can't keep doing the same things we are doing and expect it will one day be enough to bring the change and the growth in which we had hoped.

With our new church still in its embryo stage, I wonder who we will become. I believe we have some critical work to do together. Mission and vision, strategies and goals lie just around the corner. We will need to be aware of the necessity to not fall into the same old rut of familiarity. We must be bold, we must cast our eyes on the church God wants us to become. What does that look like? I ask that you extend grace in the process, knowing we will make mistakes. But we'll learn from those mistakes and be better for it. I trust that God does have a plan for our future. Not a plan meant for harm, but a plan meant for good. One that leads to our future with hope. May it be so.

CPR Training Class

On Saturday, April 15th, from 9am to 11am, the Scottsbluff First United Methodist Church Wellness Council will be hosting a CPR training class that is free to anyone who would like to attend. The class will take place in Fellowship Hall and will be taught by Regional West education coordinator Dallas Schaffer, with assistance from members of the Scottsbluff Fire Department. There is no charge for the class, but there will be a \$17 fee if you wish to obtain a CPR training card. There will be a signup sheet on the bulletin board by the church office, or you can call the church to get signed up if you wish to attend. Everyone is welcome, but anyone under 12 years of age will need to be accompanied by an adult. Mouth to mouth resuscitation is no longer required for certification and the focus is mostly on chest compression only. This training will also allow you to learn how to use the church's automated external defibrillator (AED). This is a great opportunity to learn a skill that could potentially save a life.

SEDER MEAL

The Seder Meal will be at 6 pm on Thursday, April 6. The program itself is quite the experience. We will sit at tables in the fellowship hall and it will be an interactive experience. The mood of the Seder is one of joyous celebration, with full voices and good cheer. Yet moments are also reserved for somber reflection and silence. Passover is, indeed, a "solemn" occasion, but mostly in the sense of having a deep spiritual significance and of being prepared for with great care. We who eat this Passover must be willing to laugh as well as to cry, to enjoy fellowship with one another, and to participate with fervor. Besides the ritual foods, we will have a complete meal of roast beef, mashed potatoes and gravy, green beans and dessert. Cost is \$10/person and \$30/family. I encourage all ages to come experience the Seder. Sign-up by the office.

MERGER INFORMATION

Administrative Councils from all four churches will comprise our transition team. We met for about 2 hours in the Parlor on Sunday, March 26, at 2 pm with approximately 24 people present. We introduced ourselves, sharing the location we attend, and something we have seen other churches do that interest us. A few of us slipped into the nostalgia of the past, but for the most part, we were forward thinking. There was an exciting energy in the room as we worked on our mission, vision and values for our new church. The mission. vision, and values are statements that define an organizations purpose, direction, and expectations. We looked at several statements from larger United Methodist Churches and then arrived at the following: Our Mission: Make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

We value and promote:

- -Spiritual growth and belonging
- -Bible Centered connections
- -Loving Hospitality
- -Dedication to tangibly serving and caring for all generations.


