Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! This past month of May we've been showing a video on the construction of our church. Ground breaking ceremonies were held on May 19, 1946. The first spade of earth was turned by Beech Coleman, a veteran of 40 years and a member of the Board of Trustees. His daughter tells how for several days prior to the ground breaking, Beech was hauling water over to the site to soften the dirt in order to make the ground breaking easier. As I watch that video, I see the incredible work ethic and passion of our people to build something that would last well into the future. It was hard work, caused extreme stress on the pastor and the church leaders. Sacrifices were necessary in order to be successful. One person, Mrs. A. K. Warrick, had rented out all the rooms in her home and was sleeping on a cot in her kitchen so she would be able to make substantial financial gifts to help her church along. According to our first 100 year history book, Mrs. Warrick sold her farm and gave it to the church in order to pay for the beautiful stained glass Rose window so dearly loved by all who worship with us. These sacrifices are only a small example of those made by so many in our church.

Our church grew and grew over the years. You have all heard the stories of the glory days. I've heard them too. When I first moved to Scottsbluff and was able to spend some time getting to know you, these were the stories you shared with me. People longed to go back to those days when the church was full of families and children, when we were humming on all cylinders, active and alive. A lot has changed in the past 50 years. Even 23 years ago, we had a membership of nearly 1800 people, according to our history book of the first 100 years. Today our membership is at 487, almost a fourth of what it was. We look forward to this new direction. I feel God has guided us to this merger that is before us, creating one church in four locations, with a centralized leadership team, combining our resources and energy in order to grow and to give us new life.

Stephen Ministry Caring Corner

Stephen Ministry offers a proven and effective way to organize, equip, and supervise a team of congregation members called Stephen Ministers to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the congregation and the community experiencing life difficulties. Currently we have 8 active Stephen Ministers and 4 active Stephen Leaders.

Stephen Ministry provides emotional and spiritual care for people dealing with a wide range of life difficulties. Some common caregiving situations for Stephen Ministers include helping a person dealing with: grief, a major medical crisis, job loss, divorce, break-up, broken relationships, family caregiver stress, end of life, hospice, long-term illness, financial difficulties, major life transitions, etc. Through Stephen Ministry, people experiencing these types of crises can receive excellent care for as long as needed.

Stephen Ministers provide emotional and spiritual care and support-not practical assistance such as medical care, home maintenance, transportation, or childcare, although they may help care receivers explore and identify other ways to meet those needs. They also do not minister to couples, families, minors, or dealing with addictions or mental disorders.

Consider getting involved in Stephen Ministry either as a trained Stephen Minister or a Care Receiver. Contact one of our Stephen Ministry Leaders: Barb Ropp, Megan Massey, Julie Schaff, or Marg Dredla for more information. We look forward to growing this ministry as we add Mitchell, Morrill, and Henry Churches. Spread the word about this Ministry within our church.

Merger Update

The votes have been counted for our new church name. The name with the most votes is The Vine United Methodist Church! Thank you to all who participated in the voting process. The count was as follows: Disciples -18, New Vision -81, Faith -87, and The Vine -93, with a total of 279 persons participating.

The transition team, which is made up of all four church's Ad Councils (and a few others) have confirmed the name, and it will now come before the Charge Conference as our new name in the merger documents.

We have contracted with a Logo company to create our logo. We are evaluating various curriculum for our children and student ministries. We have bids out to church insurance companies, and will have our new church budget complete and ready for approval at our charge conference scheduled for1 pm on June 17th. We are making plans for our inaugural worship service to be held at Trails West pavilion on July 9. The transition team continues to work hard and will keep everyone updated on the progress of our new church. Stay tuned!

June Outreach

The June Outreach mission benefits the Soup Kitchen and Wednesday Sack Lunch programs.....

The Soup Kitchen provides meals three times a week at three different sites: Monday at Our Lady of Guadalupe, Wednesday at the Gering Methodist Church and Thursday at the First Presbyterian Church. FUMC is responsible for the meal on the second Thursday of each month at the Presbyterian Church.

Wednesday Sack Lunches began as a way to feed the hungry during the pandemic. FUMC alternates with St. Francis Episcopal Church in handing out sack lunches on 20th Street.

The Soup Kitchen can use sturdy paper plates, bowls, napkins, 6 or 8 oz plastic cups and plastic silverware. Sack Lunch program needs monetary donations to pay for the lunch contents.
